P.D. Hinduja College of Nursing has Management Information System for various Management Information system for various administrative purposes. HR related functions such as attendance & leave records, leave reimbursement is automated through SPINE software.

Payroll related records such as payslips, generation of Form 16, Tax forecasting and investment disclosure is generated through HGS, widely used online portal. Inventory Management is automated through centralised MIS uniform to both Hinduja Hospital & CON.

Regarding academic aspects, library processes such as accession register, issue & receipt, Fine management are manged through software namely KOHA. Other important academic processes such as eligibility, examination, submission of internal assessment is automated through dedicated MIS at university level. Student's attendance record is maintained through Biometrics. Online administration of assignments, submission & assessment is managed through Google Classroom

15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

College has revolutionary institutional nursing curriculum with inclusion of various multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary programs right from inception.

College conducts Basic Research Methodology Workshop on annual basis which is multidisciplinary in nature. Also, some of the value-added modules such as Optimizing Injection Technique, Wound care are also multidisciplinary in nature.

Interdisciplinary program such as workshop on trauma nursing, accreditation exposure are implemented annually.

16.Academic bank of credits (ABC):

Indian Nursing Council has introduced Credit based revised syllabus for BSc Nursing program. Our college too being affiliated with Maharashtra University of Health Sciences has implemented the revised syllabus from 2022. With the implementation of new syllabus, our college has revised attendance system through use of biometrics for tracking credit attainment of every student. Also, we have created centralised system of credit accumulation and redemption at institutional level using open-source technology. Time table template is restructured to reflect credit hours facilitating week wise tracking of credit hours completion.

Not as an individual institution but affiliating university has been registered under ABC to permit learners for multiple entries and exits during chosen program.

As a preparation for implementing ABC at institutional level, some of the good practices are initiated at college level. These good practices include inhouse digital system for credit tracking, accumulation & redemption, development & introduction of validated proforms such as attendance sheet, progress tracker and time table specific to credit system. Lastly introduction of

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biometrics as valid & authentic proof for credit hour attainment by each student in parr with global standards.

17.Skill development:

Since the Nursing syllabus is entirely competency-based, thrust is always on clinical competency development. Apart from stipulated clinical experience, various added programs such as Clinical Competency Assurance (CCA), Outcome Focussed Module (OFM), Structured Integrated Practice are part of institutional curriculum and implemented annually.

Preclinical simulations are carried out in dedicated subject specific labs as well as newly inaugurated simulation lab. Clinical experience is augmented through paid affiliation to various speciality & super speciality hospitals in a city apart from state of art, 400 bedded parent hospital. Completely supervised clinical experience is provided to UG students. PG students are made part of initiatives such as Team Nursing, Preceptorship etc. Work place-based assessments such Direct observation of Procedural Skills, Mini-Cex are part of clinical portfolio of every student. Dedicated system namely digital competency tracker is created to track the real time performance regarding competency attainment of every student.

Formative Assessment of skill attainment is evaluated through OSCE, end posting practical examination, Clinical Drills, Bedside clinic etc.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

College has initiated integration of Indian Knowledge System through institutional curriculum for all the courses. A dedicated program aimed at enhancing spiritual knowledge namely Ancient Scripture Program is implemented across all the courses. Through this program, students are oriented to teachings from various holy books from all the religion. Cultural influences and variations are appreciated & highlighted through celebration of various festivals such as Onam, Diwali, Christmas.

A dedicated module on Yoga is implemented for first year BSc Nursing students. Fourth year BSc students have separate unit on Alternative System of Medicine emphasizing on Ayurveda, Unani & Siddha. PG students are encouraged to undertake research projects

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to check effectiveness of Indian originated strategies such as yoga, meditation on life style related diseases or any other health issue.

Faculty from college were part of task force constituted for translating nursing syllabus in local language.

19. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE): Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

Entire nursing syllabus is outcome-based emphasizing on attainment of specified competencies at each year. Program outcomes, course outcomes & program specific outcomes are identified, communicated to various stakeholders mainly students and tracked through dedicated digital system at college.

Course wise and subject wise competencies are identified, communicated to students, and tracked through various formative assessment techniques. These course wise & subject wise outcomes are related to cognitive, psychomotor & affective domain and is vividly reflected in institutional curriculum.

The multiple pedagogical approaches like flipped classroom, case-based instruction, project-based learning, art-integrated learning, experiential learning, group discussions, brainstorming, role plays, field-based learning like visits to industrial units, research labs are regularly implemented to promote constructive learning and active involvement of learners to achieve the pre-defined goals.

Continuous Comprehensive assessment is undertaken exposing students to both deliberate practice and regular feedback. This ensures attainment of course and program outcomes in an incremental & steady manner.

20.Distance education/online education:

College is pioneer in conceptualising and implementing blended learning programs such as Fellowship in Lactation Nursing Practitioner in affiliation with Maharashtra University of Health Sciences and Certificate Course in Wound Care Nursing in affiliation with World Federation of Critical Care Nursing. Both the programs are credit based implemented through both online and offline mode.

College has commenced one more blended program namely Fellowship

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program in Emerging Nurse Leadership in affiliation with Critical Care Nurses Society, India in year 2022.

Valued added programs such as Module on Child Abuse, Accreditation Exposure, Operating Techniques are also implemented through blended or completely online mode.

Every class has dedicated Google classroom to augment learning experiences through innovative pedagogy such as flipped classroom, quiz-based learning etc.

Social Media such as whats app is used for conducting travel tutorials facilitating effective utilization of travelling time.

In view of revised BSc nursing syllabus, real time digital competency tracker is used for enabling students to track their performance regarding competency attainment.

CURRICULAR ASPECTS

1.1 - Curricular Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 - The Institution ensures effective curriculum planning, delivery and evaluation through a well defined process as prescribed by the respective regulatory councils and the affiliating University.

Curriculum Planning

P D Hinduja college of Nursing has structured and organized processes for effective curriculum planning, delivery and evaluation in tune with prescribed syllabi by central conical and affiliating university.

Strategies such as biennial Curriculum Convention, annual 360 degree feedback and curriculum audits help to identify gaps in existing curriculum implementation. Recommendations, action plans based on identified gaps are carefully analyzed by Curriculum Committee for any suitable modification. Then approved action plans are implemented at college level through decentralized departmental system.

Curriculum Delivery

Before commencement of academic term, academic calendar is prepared and displayed on website. Vice principal in consultation with HODs, finalize departmental and master rotation plans. Heads of various departments further prepare department specific academic calendar to meet prescribed and additional curricular requirements. Class coordinators are responsible for 100% implementation of academic calendar to ensure sound preparedness of students much before their summative examination.

Curriculum Evaluation

Curriculum specific feedback is obtained from students at the end of academic year. Feedback from other stakeholders is also sought through various forums such as parent teacher meeting, alumni reunion, and employer feedback system.

This systematic process has helped to deliver quality nursing education & deliver graduates & postgraduates with appropriate graduate's attributes as per the emerging needs of healthcare sector in India and abroad.

Student centric methods are used for enhancing learning experiences by:

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1. Experiential Learning

Activities such as Field trips, Reflective learning, Journaling, direct clinical experience are conducted to facilitate experiential learning.

2. Integrated / Inter Disciplinary Learning

Horizontal integration of Medical Surgical Nursing, Pharmacology and Pathology implemented through integrated teaching modules. Interdisciplinary courses such as Basic Research Methodology Workshop, Child Psychiatric Workshop are conducted annually.

3. Participatory Learning

Methods include Case based Learning, Workshops, Panel Discussion, Exhibition & Debates are conducted regularly.

4. Problem Solving Methodologies

Activities such as Mind & Concept Mapping, Implementation of Nursing Process, Case studies help to enhance Critical Thinking & Problem solving skills.

5. Self-Directed Learning

Online modules such as Child Abuse, Basics in Diagnostics are conducted apart from student initiated group projects.

6. Patient Centric & Evidence based Learning

Case based learners, Clinical narratives, Bedside Clinics are regular features of clinical experience.

7. Learning in Humanities

Role play based learning, Film screening, use of music as therapeutic interventions, value added module such as Empathy & Attitude Building Modules are organized annually.

8. Project based Learning

Individual/ Group research project at B.Sc. Level, Project based activities in small & large groups such as development of LRM, virtual or 3D Models of Clinical facilities are some of the examples of Group based learning.

9. Role Play

Regularly used for concrete understanding of various theories of development as well as during implementation of Information, Education & Communication activities for community awareness.

College ensures full transparency in the process of evaluation. Evaluated answers booklets of unit tests and periodical exams are shown to students, signatures are taken on answer sheets indicating their acceptance of evaluation. Any student who is unsatisfied with her evaluation can approach the concerned HOD. If student is not satisfied even after HOD's intervention, can write to Grievance Redressal committee. Committee organizes meeting within three days of Grievance receipt. It is mandatory for Grievance Redressal Committee to finalize verdict within 7 days of receiving complaint.

In case of University examination, mainly grievances are of two types. The first type of grievances is related to question paper setting. Such Grievances are forwarded to COE through college with the recommendations for necessary actions.

Second type of Grievance is regarding evaluation after publication of results. If unsatisfied with obtained scores, students can apply for recounting of marks and availing Xerox copies of answer sheets within stipulated 7 days after announcement of results for which necessary administrative support is provided.

Assigned engineer from HNH visits college on regular basis as a part of infrastructure maintenance. Cleanliness of campus is maintained with adequate number of outsourced housekeeping staff. Facilities such as elevators, water purifiers, solar system, and Pestcontrol are maintained through service agreements/AMCs with vendors. Electrician visits twice in a week for preventive maintenance or fixing any issues related to electricity. Carpenter too visits the campus on regular basis for carpentry related work. Standard Operating Procedures are present for routine infrastructure maintenance activities such as curtain change, laundry etc. State of art Laboratories are maintained by assigning dedicated faculty for individual lab as an In-charge. All other student support facilities are maintained by dedicated faculty and responsibility is rotated every year. Hostel facilities are kept functional through close vigilance by warden.

An integrated waste management strategy which comprises of Waste minimization in the form of proper waste segregation and utilization is adopted.

Segregation of solid waste at source:

Dry Waste: Dry waste generated is then collected separately for waste Disposal. Newspapers as well used office papers are sold to the Scrap Collector.

Wet Waste: Wet waste such as kitchen food waste is collected separately in bins which are kept on all the floors in each room. Wet waste generated is then disposed in Bio compost unit for processing.

Liquid Waste: Effluent Treatment plant (ETP) is installed for the treatment of effluent generated during the process of utilization, washing of containers & floors. If the hazardous constituents are

present even after processing, then the ETP sludge is disposed through Hazardous Waste Treatment, Storage and Disposal Facility.

Biomedical Waste Management: Biomedical Waste generated is collected in separate colour coded bags as per CDC guidelines and sent to parent institution for disposal. Sharps are discarded in puncture proof container.

E Waste: E waste inventory of major equipment is maintained annually for all the electronic items. E- Waste generated is sent to parent institution for disposal.

Education Intervention (EI) Bundle selected for phase I project implementation was , Simulated Nursing Process (K/K Think Like a Nurse project improves critical thinking & clinical judgement skills preparing nurses to encounter real life clinical situations.

Well developed, Outcome focussed Structured Clinical plan in the curriculum of each academic yearsets the base for the development of basic clinical skills. Safe &Controlled learning environment oflaboratories through creation of simulation lab provides students with an opportunity to practiseclinical skills and enhance their readiness for an actual clinical environment. Some of the methodsused in the instruction of basic nursing skills are the use of static mannequins, low-fidelity simulation(LFS), case studies , OSCE and roleplaying. Industry linkages have helped students to enrol inworkshops such as Optimizing Injection Technique, Stoma Care &Wound dressing. Well planned Clinical Competency Assurance (CCA) with micro skill sessions, redemonstrations, OSCE stations areorganised annually. Structured Clinical Supervision, pre clinical simulation, Team Nursing andPreceptorship both in UG and PG Courses. Bridging course for development of "Must Know" competencies is organised at the end of each academic year. Integrated Practise is placed in FinalYear BSc Nursing. PG students are given clinical exposure in parent hospital &super specialityhospitals. Competency tracker is also being maintained as part of continuous clinical assessment. Competency log is maintained by every student on which signature of clinical supervisor ismandatory. PG students are also notified &encouraged to participate in speciality specificworkshops organised by other institutes in city or state.

8.1.3 - Students are exposed to quality of care and patient safety procedures including infection prevention and control practices as practiced by the teaching hospital in didactic and practical sessions during their clinical postings.

Concept of infection is introduced to nursing students as a part of first year curriculum through subjects such as Microbiology and Nursing Foundation. Students are taught basic steps of hand washing technique prior to even beginning procedural skills. Classes by Infection Control Nurse help students to get oriented to Hospital Acquired Infection & it's Management. Parent hospital also has a well-established Infection Control Protocol in place. Posters on hand washing techniques, standard safety precautions, and bio medical waste segregation are displayed at nursing stations and prominent places in the hospital. Students are oriented to Infection Control Practises through reading assignment on Infection Control Manual available on Intranet. Session on Role of Infection Control Nurse is organised as a part of Extended & Expanded Roles of Nurse. Didactic lectures on Universal Precautions, Needle Stick Injury, and Post Exposure Prophylaxis are organised in collaboration with parent hospitals. Hospital organises Quality & Safety week every year, during which various sensitization programs & events related to patient safety are organised. Some of the exclusive events include Room of Clues, Treasure Hunt, Pictionary and Poster Presentations on Quality Initiatives taken at departmental level.
